GETTING TO ST. JOHN FISHER COLLEGE

Driving Directions:

St. John Fisher College is six miles southeast of Rochester, NY, in the suburb of Pittsford. The New York State Thruway (I-90) runs south of the Pittsford.

The easiest approach is from Thruway Exit 45, which is marked "Rochester-490."

From that point, take I-490 North for about 10 minutes to Exit 25, Fairport Road/NY 31F.

Turn left onto Rt31F going west and proceed 1/2 mile to the main entrance of campus.

The main entrance, 1/2 mile from I-490, is at a traffic light where Fairport Road meets East Avenue (Route 96).

By RTS:

RTS Bus #17 to Kearney Hall at St. John Fisher College or RTS Bus #21 to the Park & Ride at Interstate 490 and Route 31F.
